The Sports Premium grant is funding from the government designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sports activities they offer their pupils. Below is a summary of our spending for the academic year 2018/2019. The total funding allocated for this period was £17,460.

To continue to enhance the PE curriculum and access to specialist PE opportunities in the local community.	Year 5/6 children will continue to visit Botwell Leisure Centre to have access to gymnastics coaches and a specialised gymnasium, QPR football coaches and the sports hall, swimming coaches and the different swimming pools depending on children’s ability. This will improve community access for the children and work on their physical skills development in key areas. The 5/6 children will also have further support the development of their social and interaction skills.	£10,378
To offer swimming lessons for all year 5/6 classes alongside weekly sessions for KS1 classes.	For children to have access to swimming lessons with a trained swimming instructor and swimming assistant. This will aim to develop children’s low muscle tone and increase their self-esteem and confidence when swimming. This will improve children’s activity levels and thereby have a positive impact on their overall health and well-being. Swimming also supports the children’s sensory developments and allows them structured time to access the water and develop their sensory skills in line with their individual sensory profiles.	£4940
To continue to give equal opportunities for all children with updated and increased PE equipment to support the teaching of all areas of the PE curriculum.	PE instructor has ordered increased volume of equipment to support children’s needs in PE lessons and ensure coverage of all areas of the PE curriculum.
