The Sports Premium grant is funding from the government designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sports activities they offer their pupils. Below is a summary of our spending for the academic year 2018/2019. The total funding allocated for this period was £17,460.

To continue to enhance the PE curriculum and access to specialist PE opportunities in the local community.	Year 5/6 children will continue to visit Botwell Leisure Centre to have access to gymnastics coaches and a specialised gymnasium, QPR football coaches and the sports hall, swimming coaches and the different swimming pools depending on children's ability. This will improve community access for the children and work on their physical skills development in key areas. The 5/6 children will also have further support the development of their social and interaction skills.	Year 5/6 children have regularly attended sessions and enjoy going into the community to Botwell until March 2020 due to COVID restrictions. From the time spent at Botwell the children have increased their fitness levels and built on new skills from the targeted work with the specialist coaches in swimming, gymnastics and football.	£10,378
To offer swimming lessons for all year 5/6 classes alongside weekly sessions for KS1 classes.	For children to have access to swimming lessons with a trained swimming instructor and swimming assistant. This will aim to develop children's low muscle tone and increase their self-esteem and confidence when swimming. This will improve children's activity levels and thereby have a positive impact on their overall health and well-being. Swimming also supports the children's sensory developments and allows them structured time to access the water and develop their	All children have had access to the swimming pools and instructors at Botwell alongside support from school staff when in the pool. Children's enjoyment has increased which has led to an increase in parents taking their children swimming outside of these sessions. Children's mobility and muscle tone has developed alongside their sensory developments.	£4940
